Text: Book Antiqua 10 or Times 12

Indented quotations and endnotes: Book Antiqua 9 or Times 10

Punctuation

• **Outside** quotation marks:

As Mowbray challenged his king, "My life thou shalt command, but not my shame", he backed him right into the downstage left corner.

• Single space after **all** punctuation marks (comma, colon, semicolon, full stop, exclamation mark, query, etc.).

• Double inverted commas: "My life", single inverted commas for inside quotes:

As Professor X has noted: "Directors have Mowbray backing into a corner as he challenges his king, 'My life thou shalt command...'. This is revealing of..."

References

No page numbers or other edition references should appear in the body of the article. Such details should be given in the notes.

Act and scene references as follows: V.4.154-59 in brackets after a quotation

In text: Act IV Scene 2

Quotations

• Book Antiqua 9 or Times 10

• Indented 0,5cm (if possible) when quoting more than two lines, as follows:

Lysander. Where is Demetrius? O, how fit a word

Is that vile name to perish on my sword! (II.2.106-07)

• When quoting less, run into the text, giving quotation references in brackets:

Antonio compares himself to a gelded ram, "a tainted wether of the flock" (*Merchant of Venice*, IV.1.114), and this castration...
